I love the fall, it's my favorite season. I actually like when it when it gets darker, and for that matter I like getting older too. Nothing against our wonderful children and youth, they are enjoying their springtime of life, and well they should. But even as I get up a little slower in the morning, ride fewer miles on bike, and have to eat less than ever just to maintain my weight, I am still a better version of me than I ever have been. I am wiser, more patient, more generous, more bold. None of that is bragging, because God has worked those things in me, often through some bumpy lessons.
